

MINUTES

Super Neighborhood 68, August 19, 2025

6:00 p.m., 5330 Griggs Rd

Attendees: Civic Clubs/Associations Represented: LaSalette Place, Scott Terrace, MacGregor Place, MacGregor Palms-Terrace, South Union

Meeting was called to order by Interim President J. Brown at 6 p.m. All attendees were asked to introduce themselves. The purpose of SN68 was discussed by our Interim President. Previous minutes approved.

Bylaws were discussed by B. Adjei. Covered during this discussion were officers needed, attendees were referred to bylaws for qualifications for each position. The map on page 10 was referenced as the boundary location required for those participating in Super Neighborhood 68, individuals must reside within this boundary. Information as to how delegates and alternate delegates were selected. In order for individual residents to become officers or assume an active role within SN68, civic club/organization membership within SN68 is required. Businesses, profits/nonprofits, institutions, faith-based organizations must own, or operate within SN68 boundary. The regular SN68 meetings are opened to the public

L. Tyron indicated that the SN68 meeting date on the 2nd Thursday interfered with their LaSalette meetings date/time. Discussions regarding SN68 meeting date for LaSalette has been ongoing. Suggestions have been that LaSalette send a delegate who could attend these 4 times a year meeting. Other suggestions were the first of the year 2026, the dates for the SN68 meeting would be revisited. It was also noted the current date of SN68 meeting was in line with the location of the SN68 meeting place.

There were questions as to how to determine who resided within SN68 area. Since individuals are required to join a civic club/organization, must reside within SN68, and civic clubs/organizations must submit letter as to representation, this was considered as verification

Attendees were asked to fill in and return forms listing 5 important items (level of importance 1-5) that would benefit SN68.

Guest: Pam Davis, CCPPI (Center for Civic and Public Policy Improvement) gave a brief summary of how the organization works to improve voting.
