Super Neighborhood 68 – June 11, 2026

6:00 p.m. 5330 Griggs Rd

Meeting was called to order at approximately 6:00 p.m. by President Adjei. Due to the large attendance, meeting was moved to 5330 Griggs the HBDI Training Room. Minutes were read and approved.

Reports were given by the following Civic Association: LaSalette Place, MacGregor Trails, MacGregor Palms-Terrace, Scott Terrace, Southern Trails.

Sgt Cousins, Pct 7 welcomed special guests on behalf of Constable Phillips, who was unable to attend. An overview of what to expected from the FIFA group coming into Houston was shared. Human trafficking is at an all time high, especially during large event. The hotline number for reporting was provided 1888 373-7888, and the number for Pct 7, 713 643-6602. Residents were cautioned against giving rides or falling for scams.

Myron Jones of Harris County Flood gave an update of Harris County Flood areas in Houston. Flood Maps were distributed. It was noted the maps were yet in the draft stage. Some flooding was related to the City of Houston therefore Mr. Jones explained the county cannot regulate the City of Houston permits and the city is responsible for some of the drainage. Mr. Jones' report was very informative.

The remainder of the meeting was turned over to the University of Houston and Dr. Elwyn Lee was introduced. His employment at the UH has been for 47 years. Dr. Lee introduced his team. A video was shown of the various services, departments, and programs at the University of Houston. Some programs of interests are: Healthy Start, Bounce, Entrepreneurship Training, Project Row House's Community Health Workforce, as well as the Legal Clinic. Some programs are available to the community of which SN68 will be pursuing. University of Houston is providing services to areas in 3rd Ward, Boynton Church and other locations. One particular program is the 3rd Ward Community Cloth. There maybe grant monies available for some programs. There are 48,950 students enrolled at the University of Houston Central Campus. Within this enrollment are the UH Health Services, Tilman Fertitta Family College of Medicine, the College of

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Optometry, College of Liberal Arts & Social Sciences, and the Graduate School of Social work to name a few. This was a very detailed presentation.

President Adjei asked for additional volunteers to serve on the NNO committee. An award will be given to the Civic Association with the most attendees. Contest will end on October 6, 2026. Everyone was encouraged to sign up and volunteer on a committee.
